


Locations

Hidden amongst the hills and rainforest that cover this island are waterfalls and fishing villages where the locals still live in stilted houses.

This map will give you an overview of some of the local attractions found on Thailand's fourth largest, and least populated island.



Klong Chao Waterfall

Visit the stunning Klong Chao waterfall. Take a dip in its cooling freshwater lagoon and swim beneath its refreshing cascades.

Huang Nam Keaw Waterfall

Further up from Klong Chao waterfall is this hidden gem, deep in the jungle. A refreshing oasis during the rainy season, this waterfall that splashes down over multiple levels is worth the journey.



Ao Yai Fishing Village

Located on the south-east coast of Koh Kood, Ao Yai is a picturesque glimpse into the lives of local fishermen, with its stilted houses and walkways that hug one side of the bay.

Ao Salat Fishing Village

On the north-east tip of Koh Kood, Ao Salat is a fishing village and the main entry point onto the island. Here you will find local shops selling dried seafood brought in on the fishing boats.



The Solar Reef and Koh Raet

Soneva Kiri's Solar Reef is a thriving man-made reef garden. Powered by the sun, it attracts an array of marine species.

Just five minutes from Soneva Kiri by boat, Koh Raet is one of Koh Kood's most unique dive spots. Snorkel around the sunken sculptures and explore the dense coral formations.

Koh Rang

With clear, clean waters, abundant with marine life, the Koh Rang Yi National Marine Park is a short 45-minute boat ride from Koh Kood.



Mai Si Airport

Located a mere five-minute speedboat ride from Soneva Kiri, Koh Mai Si is the resort's airport island.

Chonticha's Seafood

Chonticha is a local Koh Kood chef whose restaurant serves authentic Thai cuisine. All of the seafood on the menu is freshly caught by local fishermen.



Kruua Mae Tuk

This renowned restaurant is located in a classically Thai, stilted wooden structure amongst the mangroves encircling Klong Yai Kee waterfall.

With a 'no-menu' dining concept, Chef Tuk's vast selection of Thai dishes is inspired by ingredients produced on Koh Kood the nearby Koh Chang, and seafood freshly caught by local fishermen.




Treepod Dining
